Strolling poets from the Williamstown Writers Group wearing sandwich boards will encourage people to write spontaneous poetry at all events through the festival.

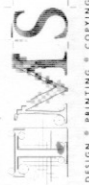

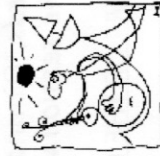

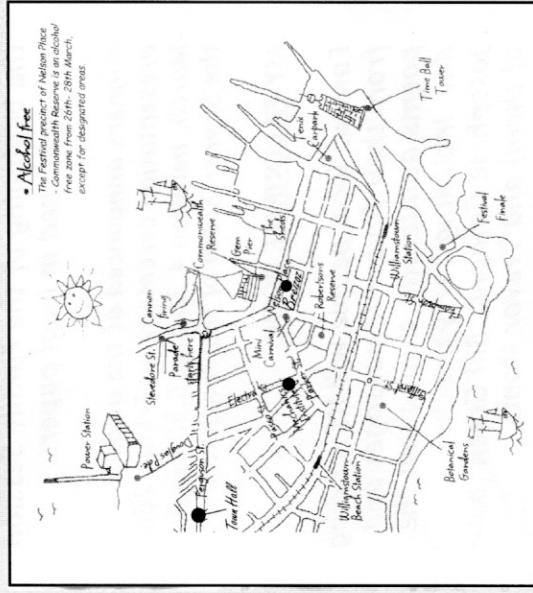
